Dave Mills, President of the Bristol Sports Hall of Fame

In addition to our annual events, the Bristol Sports Hall of Fame (BSHOF) with the co-operation of the Bristol Tramps and the Bristol Bd. of Education, sponsored a fundraising event entitled *"Raise the Roof"* on behalf of Shepard Meadows Therapeutic Riding Center. The event featured UConn men's varsity basketball coach Jim Calhoun and Dan Doyle, founder of the Institute of International Sport. Both men delivered inspiring messages on "Life Lessons from Sport". Proceeds from the event, which amounted to over \$11,000 will be used to begin construction on a roof to cover the riding facility which will enable them to extend the riding season and thus benefit more riders. The program was a huge success and acted as a spring board for additional funds to be raised to complete the project.

The HOF was also the recipient of the prestigious "Ambassador of Peace" award recently at a Mohegan Sun ceremony. We were chosen for our outstanding work in the Bristol Community by the Institute of International Sport which will sponsor the "World Peace Summit" this summer at the University of Connecticut. Robert Fiondella Leadership Council Speakers Marc Gonsalves and Bob Freimuth

The September 14th gathering featured Bristol native Marc Gonsalves. He spoke of his February, 2003 ordeal when he was captured by the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Columbia. The abduction took place when Gonzales and his two co-workers were on a U. S. drug surveillance mission in Columbia's cocaine producing jungle when their plane crashed. He was later rescued in July, 2008.

"I would never wish that on anyone," he told the students. He said it was important he wasn't alone." "I'm glad my co-workers were with me, he said. "It was critical to have them with me. With three different people, one would fill in when the others suffered. One of us would compensate for the others."

This point was directed to the students so they would better realize every member of a team is valuable. You can't do it alone. "The value of people around - you might not realize how important they are - we needed each other, thus we survived."

The speaker at the December 14, 2010 meeting was Robert Freimuth, Varsity Baseball Coach at Plainville High School and winner of 5 state championships. Coach Freimuth talked about some of the players he has coached who went onto careers in the NFL, MLB and the Secret Service. The one common thread all these former players had was great leadership skills. Those leadership traits included Courage, Big Thinkers, Change Masters, Persistence, Risk Takers, Positive Attitudes, Decision Makers, Responsibility Takers, having a Sense of Humor and Being Committed 110% all the time.

Coach Freimuth's message was well received by the student-athletes and gave them plenty of food for thought.

The Bristol Sports Hall of Fame Leadership council, consisting of over 60 student-athletes from the three local high schools, participated in the United Way's annual Day of Caring. This year the students assisted the United Way, in their initiative to inform senior citizens of assistance available to them in the community, by placing door hangers on doors throughout the City.

BSHOF also assisted the United Way in their annual Joy of Sharing holiday program by contributing presents to be distributed to children in the community in need of some assistance

Jack Hines Scholar Athlete Dinner

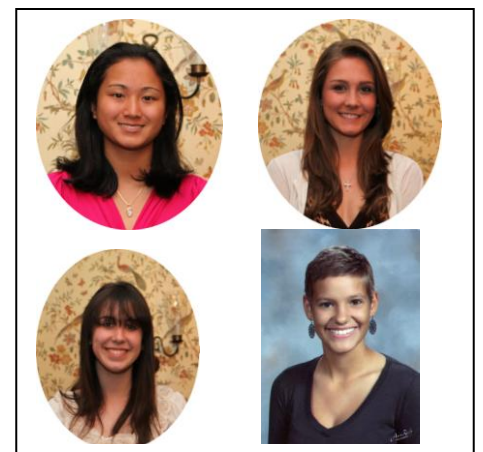

He served as a coach, a mentor, a father, a taxi driver, a board member, an administrator, and most of all a friend to thousands of youngsters.
